WHAT SHOULD ONE DO IF INTERESTED?

Scholarships and Financial Considerations – Drive for Academic Excellence. Public vs. Private (individual situations will differ).
How far away from home?
International, Domestic and Regions to think about.
Are climate, city size, and social activities important?
Connecting with Coaches and what to look for? (i.e. Tenure, Staff Size, Roster Size, Graduation by Position, Style of Play, Athletic Profile, Interviewing.)
Social Media self-promotion and warnings. (Necessary but be deliberate.)
Hiring a Recruiter or not? (Costs vs. Benefits)
College ID Camps & Showcases – Timing when offered due to college season.
Individual Player Profile and Registering with the NCAA.

WHEN SHOULD ONE START?



Ideally and in general,

Some college clinics, ID Events, and Showcases are offered as early as 8th grade. This allows players to get on college coaches' radar. Coaches may not be able to directly communicate with you, but you can with them.

Boys = 9th Grade

Girls = 8th Grade
